Why should I care?

- * power(CLI) > power(GUI)
- Automation: If you can do it on the CLI you can do it in a script. (Theoretically)
- It's fun* to make your own personal dev environment.
- Track config in GitHub \Rightarrow you can configure new computers easily.
- * "It makes you more productive." Maybe.

» Q: How? A: Practice & Dotfiles.

- * Typically, config files prefixed with . living in \$HOME, \$HOME/.config or \$XDG_CONFIG_HOME.
- * .bashrc, .zshrc, .vimrc, .gitignore, .*rc, etc.
- Recommend storing these files in Git!

- * My dotfiles are public: github.com/kinbiko/dotfiles
- \ast Almost 2^{10} commits
- $\ast\,$ More than 2^3 years of contributions.

- Supports transparency
- Live-updating config
- Allows for no borders + no title bar \Rightarrow more usable screen space.
- FAST, and reliable (rust).

» TMUX: Windows and panes and sessions

- * Split your screen however you want
- * If you close your terminal, you don't lose what you were doing
- Quickly open URLs shown on screen

Zsh: Shell

- Default shell on many systems
- Excellent user manual
- Scriptable
- Aliases and custom functions
- * Lots of community themes, not too difficult to make your own

Zsh: Theme

- Git status ⇒ different colors
- Obvious when not inside tmux
- * Shell status code $\neq 0 \Rightarrow$ skull emoji

» Neovim: Text editor

- * Like vim, but newer.
- * Lots of plugins and configurability
- * Lua
- * Vim keybindings everywhere...
 - * Browser
 - * Shell
 - * Obsidian
 - * Tmux
- * Too much to cover today can cover if there's time at the end.

More tools

- * z (aliased to sd): better cd
- * bat prettier cat
- * btop prettier top
- * gh issue create
- * direnv: pwd implies env.
- * rg "ripgrep", superfast grep.
- * espanso: snippets everywhere (not just in your terminal/editor)

Existing Software Tricks

- Diff two local files with git diff --no-index
- Global gitignore
- lazygit
- * iedit
- * gh pr checks --watch

 \mathbf{FZF}

- * prefix-s
- * checkout
- bash history
- * file paths
